

Longview ISD Parent & Family Engagement Policy

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Overview

Longview Independent School District (LISD) in Texas is committed to fostering strong partnerships between the district, schools, and families to enhance the educational experience of all students. The Parent and Family Engagement Policy is designed to meet state and federal requirements, ensuring that parents and stakeholders are actively informed and involved in their children's education.

Purpose:

The primary aim of the Parent and Family Engagement Policy is to create a collaborative environment where parents and families are empowered to support their children's academic success. This policy outlines the district's commitment to:

- 1. **Meeting State and Federal Requirements:** Ensuring compliance with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Texas Education Agency (TEA) guidelines.
- 2. **Enhancing Communication:** Providing clear, timely, transparent, and accessible communication between schools and families.
- 3. **Promoting Involvement:** Encouraging active participation of parents in school activities, decision-making processes, and educational support initiatives.
- 4. **Supporting Student Achievement:** Leveraging family engagement as a key factor in improving student academic outcomes and overall school performance.

By adhering to this policy, Longview ISD demonstrates its dedication to nurturing a supportive and inclusive educational environment. This proactive approach not only fulfills state and federal mandates but also strengthens the bond between the district, schools, and families, ultimately contributing to the academic success and well-being of all students.

State Definition: Parent and Family Engagement

Families, community members, and educators work together in an equal and respectful partnership to create and provide effective, systemwide support for student learning and development from early childhood into college, a career, or the military.

This home-school collaboration is evidenced when...

- Parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning;
- Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school;
- Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision- making and may serve on committees to assist in the education of their child.

The written Parent and Family Engagement Policy is another critical requirement for Title I, Part A program. School districts and Title I, Part A schools are both required to have written parent and family engagement policies in place.

Who Needs a Written Parent and Family Engagement Policy?

Every LEA, also known as school districts, receiving Title I, Part A funds and every school receiving Title I, Part A funds, schoolwide and targeted assistance, are required to develop a written Parent and Family Engagement Policy. The policy shall be developed with, distributed to, revised, and reviewed with parents.

- Local Educational Agency Parent and Family Engagement Policy:
 - Each local educational agency that receives funds under this part shall develop jointly with, agree on with, and distribute to, parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy. The policy shall be incorporated into the local educational agency's plan developed under section 1112, establish the agency's expectations and objectives for meaningful parent and family involvement, and describe how the agency will
 - (A) involve parents and family members in jointly developing the local educational agency plan under section 1112, and the development of support and improvement plans under paragraphs (1) and (2) of section 1111(d). ESSA 1116 (a)(2)(A).
- School Parent and Family Engagement Policy:
 - Each school served under this part shall jointly develop with, and distribute to, parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy, agreed on by such parents, that shall describe the means for carrying out the requirements of subsections (c) through (f). Parents shall be notified of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, provided in a language the parents can understand. Such policy shall be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and the school. *ESSA 1116 (b)(1)*.

Policy versus Plan

In section 1116 of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the words "policy" and "plan" are used. In statute, the LEA (school districts) *Plan* is referenced in section 1112 while the Parent and Family Engagement (PFE) *Policy* is referenced as being a section of the LEA Plan. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) does not require the usage of one word over the other regarding what is referenced in ESSA as the *PFE Policy* due to the generalization that "policies" need approval by a governing body. To meet the intent of the federal law, the PFE Policy does not have to be approved by any governing body *unless* local law requires it. The document must be easily

discernable as well as meet all requirements set forth by the federal government in section 1116 of ESSA.

Statement of Beliefs

What is it?	Longview ISD is committed to our vision: Every student matters and serves a purpose. We strive to provide high-quality education individualized for each student by developing and maintaining relationships with families and the community. One way we continue to do this is by participating in the Title I, Part A State Program. This program provides funding for low socioeconomic schools. In return, we promise to meet the expectations laid out for us by the Texas Education Agency and the United States Department of Education.	
Expectations & Objectives	Parents and families are a child's first teacher. They imitate you from the moment they are born. The expectation of our PFE Program is to foster communication and decision-making with parents about student performance and to collaboratively support learning. Our objectives are: > Effective two-way communication between school and home which is linked to a higher completion rate on homework, better attention during instructional tasks, increased participation by all parties, and improved interactions and relationships between parents, teachers, and students. > If a child's parents are more involved in school experiences, the child is more likely to have higher grades, improved behavior, better attendance, higher social skills, and adaption. > Learning together leads to better school and home life. > Being a life-long learner can prevent some health issues that often occur later in life.	
Longview ISD will:	 Have a Principals meeting to discuss Parent and Family Engagement policy needs, events and activities at different campuses, and collaboration opportunities to serve families and fulfill state guidelines. (Completed on July 23rd, 2024. Sign in sheet kept in file). Meet with district parents to elaborate, plan, develop, evaluate, and revise support and school improvement plans, parent and family engagement policy, and events. Parents from various PTAs will be contacted by the Community & Family Engagement Coordinator to be a part of this meeting. The campus administrators will provide the contact information of the parents. (Completed on October 29th, 2024. Sign in sheet and minutes kept in file). Hold quarterly meetings to seek input from community members, and educators. (Completed in May and August 2024. Sign in sheets kept in file). Distribute the PFE Policy, this document, to parents and the communities by: Posting it on our district website, and keeping it up to date. Additionally, it will be accessible in less than 5 min. Have a representative at every school's annual Title I meeting. Have a representative at every school PFE event. Per an open records request, provide the qualifications of a child's teacher Assist schools in the evaluation and revision of their PFE policy and school-parent compact. Evaluate the District Parent and Family Program and its policy throughout the year and revise it as needed. Host events and activities at every campus that will enhance parent and family engagement. If needed and requested, provide training to every district employee on the most effective PFE strategies. Meet with district parents who were part of the policy development for an annual evaluation of the PFE program.
